planning interests. It is crucial that the Town establish a temporary moratorium on the use of land and the construction of structures related to such large scale photovoltaic systems and the issuance of building permits in connection with the same.

b) Moratorium.

No building permit may be issued for the construction of any large scale ground mounted photovoltaic system in capacity greater than 35 kilowatts, until June 15, 2013."

ARTICLE 29: (Citizen Petition) The Town <u>voted and passed unanimously</u> to <u>amend</u> Article 29 to add the following instructions to the Buckland Town Clerk:

ARTICLE 29: The Town voted and passed the amended Article 29.

The People's Rights Amendment

Section 1. We, the people who ordain and establish the Constitution intend the rights protected by this Constitution to be the rights of natural persons.

Section 2. The words people, person or citizen as used in the Constitution do not include corporations, limited liability companies or other corporate entities established by the laws of any state, the United States or any foreign state. Such corporate entities are subject to such regulation as the people, through their elected state and federal representatives deem reasonable and are otherwise consistent with the powers of Congress and the States under this Constitution.

Section 3. Nothing contained herein shall be construed to limit the people's rights freedom of speech, freedom of the press, free exercise of religion, freedom of associations and all other rights of the people, which rights are inalienable.

Furthermore, we instruct the Town Clerk to please send a copy of the results to our State Senator and Representative as well as to our Federal Congressional Representative and Senators: Stan Rosenberg, Paul Mark, John Olver, John Kerry and Scott Brown as well as Stephen Kulik, who will become our State Representative in January.
